## **NOVEMBER EVENT TO CELEBRATE Common Good 10<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY**

On November 28, 2000, the Common Good State Team is sponsoring “Common Good: Celebrating Our Past, and Positioning for the Future,” to celebrate 10 years of interagency collaboration in Ohio. The focus of the day will be on addressing current challenges to collaboration at the local level. Featured speaker at the event will be John Schuster, Deputy Director, Workforce Development, Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. Joel Potts of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services has been invited to discuss the future context for collaboration. Panels consisting of State Team members and other state agency staff will address questions related to the Workforce Investment Act and other state initiatives affecting local areas. Common Good Local Linkage Teams will share successful practices that they are using to foster collaboration in their communities. A celebration of the Common Good project’s 10 years will be held during the lunch.

The event, which will be held at Southern State Community College Wilmington Campus in Wilmington, will begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 3:00 p.m. Cost will be \$25.00 per participant. Registration information will be mailed shortly.
