Activities				<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brief introduction to calling 911. Ask students if they have ever called and in what circumstances; do they have a similar service in their native countries • Emphasize that 911 is only to be called in a life-threatening situation - a medical emergency, a fire, a crime. • Students use computers to access the following website: www.tinkerbellchime.com/EL_Civics_Emergencies.html (underscore where there are spaces) • There are 38 practice questions. The questions present situations in which the student must

There are other questions in which the student must identify the type of emergency, and questions asking student to provide basic information to operators when calling 911.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• This can be done as an individual activity, but is best when done as a group and students can ask for word definitions and clarification of questions.
