This elicits prior knowledge and provides the teacher with clear understanding of the level of student knowledge about the topic. Assessment/ Evidence	Students will check own work and correct mistakes. Teacher and students can review information together to reinforce gained knowledge.
Reflection	For more advanced students, the lesson could be expanded to a research project. Students could choose one of the presidents they are interested in and search websites for additional information on that president. Students may then share several facts from this information with the class.
