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Activities	 Present the lesson objective by reading/explaining pgs. 4 and 5 of the book introduction. Direct students to glossary. Read and clarify definitions for the following vocabulary from glossary: cyberbullying, and sexting Pre-select Google sites which give examples of cyberbullying and sexting Have students go to the pre-selected sites and read the examples. Use Google language tool to allow students to read in their native language if this accommodation is necessary for understanding Read as a group (students to read aloud) pages 14-21 in the book (the pages are double spaced and large font so this is not too lengthy). Teacher to simplify and clarify word meanings as needed Group discussion/questions
Assessment/ Evidence	Group discussion and student responses to lesson.
Reflection	This is a 45 page booklet and it contains useful information for teaching the risks involved in inappropriate conduct, contact and content used through the Internet and cell phones. The book can be a significant resource for developing lessons and is also a valuable and free resource to parents.
